Manhattan is one of the five boroughs of New York City. It is located on Manhattan Island and is the smallest borough, but the third largest in population. It's home to some of the most famous landmarks in the country, such as One World Trade Center, the Empire State Building, the Chrysler building and Central Park.

New York City has got lots of parks. Central Park, in the middle of Manhattan Island, isn't the biggest, but it's probably the most famous. It opened in 1873 and today it's a beautiful area of about 3.4 km² with 25 million visitors every year. The park is called the Lungs of the City because it's got over 26,000 trees. Central Park is open from 6am to 1am. People can enjoy the environment but also do many activities throughout the year. At the park, you can play baseball, tennis, or go swimming, ice skating, cycling or running. You can also learn about how to protect nature.

In 1536, King Henry VIII started using Hyde Park for hunting deer. Today, you can't hunt deer but the park is open to everyone. Covering an area of 1.4 km2, the park is one of the largest in London. With 4,000 trees and a lake, it's a beautiful place for visitors. Lots of birds and animals live in the park and visitors can see them while walking around.

Hyde Park is open from 5am to midnight and people can do lots of things there. There's a sport area for football, cricket, softball, etc. People can also cycle, run, walk, have picnics, go swimming or horse riding. Throughout the year

there are concerts, art events and much more at the park. There are a lot of parks in London. London's royal parks are situated in the heart of the city. They provide a welcome breath of fresh air and a chance to escape the noise of the city. Not only Hyde Park but also Green Park, St. James's Park, Kensington Gardens and Regent's Park are famous royal parks.
