They need a professional to advise them.

But why? I always call my best friend to help me find the perfect dress, not a stranger! 'I can help in three different ways. The first thing I do is help my customer improve their image. I teach them to choose colours and clothes that suit them, and how to use make-up', Thomas tells me. 'Then I organise the customer's wardrobe; I might even throw away some old clothes'. The third service has to do with actual shopping: the personal shopper and the customer visit shops and buy clothes according to the customer's personality, lifestyle and needs.

'Most of my customers are rich business people who call me for important meetings or business parties', explains Thomas. 'However, I also work for people in all kinds of jobs and for retired men and women who want a change of look.' I was quite impressed, but I still didn't see why ordinary people would need someone like Thomas.

We spent the rest of the day shopping. Every time we came out of a shop, we had one more bag. In the end, I went home with a beautiful dress, two pairs of trousers, some lovely tops and a couple of coats. I'd never had a shopping day like this before! I admit that I'd spent more than I usually do, but I wouldn't have found such beautiful clothes without Thomas. I just wish personal shoppers were a bit cheaper!


