## I. READING

The expression Standing On The Shoulders Of Giants is a tribute paid by an achiever to those who went before and whose research benefited the final results. Noel Gallagher named Oasis's fourth studio album Standing on the Shoulder of Giants after noticing the idiom engraved onto the side of a £2 coin. On the Shoulders of Giants is also the title of a collection of works by the major scientists Johannes Kepler, Galileo Galilei, Isaac Newton, Albert Einstein and Nicolaus Copernicus, compiled and edited by Stephen Hawking.

It is often thought the origin of the expression goes back to Isaac Newton, who famously wrote, in a letter to his great rival Robert Hooke on 5 February 1676, that 'What Des-Cartes did was a good step. You have added much in several ways and especially in taking the colours of these plates into philosophical consideration. If I have seen a little further it is only by standing on the shoulders of Giants.' Newton was clearly accepting the great work carried out by other scientists both before and during his time that had a major part in the success he himself had achieved as a scientist.

But Newton's was not an original reference. In 1159 the author John of Salisbury wrote of Bernard of Chartres in his book, Metalogicon:

Bernard of Chartres used to say that we are like dwarfs on the shoulders of giants, so that we can see more than they, and see things at a greater distance, not by virtue of any sharpness of sight on our part, or any physical distinction, but because we are carried high and raised up by their giant stature.
