Pancake Day is the last day before Lent, about 40 days before Easter. Long ago, people ate a lot on this day because they didn't eat much during Lent. Nowadays, people traditionally eat pancakes, and in some places in the UK, women have pancake races. They run with a pancake in a frying pan and throw the pancake in the air as they run! The winner is not a person who comes first, but a woman who tosses the pancake and catches it in the frying pan the biggest number of times.

On Valentine's Day (February 14th) people give a card to the person they love – their wife, husband, boyfriend or girlfriend. People buy over one billion Valentine's cards every year! They often give flowers and chocolates, too. Some Valentine's cards are anonymous. People send them but they don't write their own name!

Many people in Scotland celebrate Burns Night on January 25th. Robert Burns was a famous Scottish poet. On Burns Night people read his poems and they eat traditional Scottish food — haggis (minced meat cooked in a sheep's stomach), potatoes and turnips. They also sing folk songs and dance.

There are lots of people from India in Britain. In October or November, they celebrate Diwali, an Indian festival. The festival lasts three days. People decorate their houses with lights and they give each other presents. This festival is a time when they pray for wealth and happiness in the future. They also eat special spicy food, mostly vegetable curry, and sweets.
