HOBBIT actor Andy Serkis has called for computer-generated characters to be nominated for top movie awards.

Serkis, 49, said there should be no distinction at the Oscars, Baftas and Golden Globes between actors who play digitally enhanced "avatars" and those playing "in-the-flesh" roles.

His digitally-enhanced performances as Gollum in Peter Jackson's Lord Of The Rings triology, Caesar the ape in Rise Of The Planet Of The Apes, and King Kong, triggered a debate over the recognition of digital avatars.

He said: "People always say there ought be a separate category for actors playing digital avatar roles but I absolutely disagree. The process of acting is exactly the same. I have never drawn
