Wimbledon - the most famous tennis competition in the world.

Wimbledon is a place in south-west London, near Richmond, and every year there is a great tennis competition there. It's the most famous tennis competition in the world and it started in 1877. That year there weren't many spectators. Now there are over 500,000 spectators every year and millions of people watch Wimbledon on TV or listen to it on the radio.

Six thousand people work at Wimbledon. Two hundred of them are children. They collect the tennis balls after every point and throw them to the players. They are 14 or 15 years old and they practise two hours a night, four nights a week, for four months before the competition. They don't get any money but they meet the players.

Half a million spectators eat a lot of food. Every year at Wimbledon they eat 6,000 pizzas, 23,000 bananas and 190,000 sandwiches. They drink 250,000 bottles of water and over 300,000 cups of tea and coffee. The most famous food is strawberries and cream. Spectators eat 2,000 kilograms of strawberries and 7,000 litres of cream every year. Ten strawberries with cream are £2.

There are some rules for spectators. You can take pictures but you mustn't use the flash on your camera. You must switch off your mobile phone before each match. You mustn't leave the court or make a noise when the players are playing.
